| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Research</b> reflects independent thinking, and ideas are executed through the skilful application of appropriate media. The candidate has recorded from a range of sources, which are clearly relevant to their intentions. For example, the candidate has drawn and taken photographs of people of different ages, buildings and objects focusing on surface texture to explore their theme 'Fragile'.</li> <li>• Connections have been made through selecting the <b>work of relevant artists</b> to inform further study. The candidate considers alternative ways to combine imagery to communicate ideas on the fragility of life, using specific media to create different effects such as a blurred or focused effect.</li> <li>• <b>Gathering of visual evidence</b> has been carried out with purpose and is clearly related to their chosen theme, 'Fragile'.</li> <li>• There is clear and consistent evidence of the candidate directly and effectively recording from <b>primary sources</b>, with the subject in front of them. This is seen in the drawings of parts of the boy, broken ceramic vessels and the derelict building.</li> <li>• <b>Observational study</b> is accomplished, and recording explores a wide variety of visual elements such as colour, form, different angles, viewpoints and scale.</li> </ul> |  |                              |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is evidence of effective and relevant <b>exploration</b> of materials and processes and a willingness to take creative risks with media exploration, to test alternative effects. For example, the candidate has explored working in 3D with wire and papier-mâché, combining broken pieces of ceramic vessels to expand on an idea around the fragility of childhood, as well as embroidery and tie-dye to explore different ways to visually reproduce textures of aging skin.</li> <li>• Ideas have been thoroughly explored through different processes and techniques such as digital media, 3D construction, oil pastel, paint, and textiles to explore distortion of images and composition.</li> </ul>   |  |                              |

**Theme: Fragile****Mark awarded = 86 out of 100**

- The candidate has demonstrated clear understanding of the **inherent qualities** of media and has selected the most relevant in relation to their ideas. For example, pencil to record tone and form, photoshop to manipulate their images to create distortion and tie-dye to explore lines and marks seen in skin.
- There is evidence of excellent **technical skill** in the explorations, demonstrating clear understanding of the visual elements. This is seen in the tonal pencil, pen and ink and paint studies in the portfolio.

**Mark awarded = 22 out of 25 marks****AO3:** Develop ideas through investigation, demonstrating critical understanding**Excellent** development of ideas through investigation, demonstrating **effective** critical understanding

- Development is **purposeful** throughout. Initial recording provides an effective and well-considered basis for thorough exploration of concepts. For example, the candidate has drawn and taken photographs of the boy seen from different angles which are used to inform the composition of the final outcome.
- Language and vocabulary in the written annotation is personal, informative and insightful, serving to support the visual information
- The candidate has successfully used their initial research into artists to create their own individual and **original** concepts. For example, their research into various artists informs the candidate's decision to explore how to use objects to symbolise fragility in people.
- There is clear and consistent evidence that the candidate has **developed imagery**, considering alternative compositions, angles, viewpoints, designs etc., showing how their ideas and imagery moves forward. For example, they have tried working with different media, setting up scenarios to photograph and work from as they develop their idea for their final collage composition.
- The **supporting studies** clearly lead to and inform the final outcome. The candidate has explored a range of developed ideas, informed by their research and has refined these ideas to plan their final outcome effectively.
- There is clear, intelligent **reflection** on ideas and an ability to refine ideas as work progresses.

**Mark awarded = 22 out of 25 marks****AO4:** Present a personal and coherent response that realises intentions and demonstrates an understanding of visual language**Excellent** realisation of intentions, demonstrating **effective** understanding of visual language

- The **final outcome** is a cohesive conclusion to the response and is clearly informed by the supporting studies. This is evident in the imagery presented in the portfolio such as images of the boy and distorting images to use in the background.
- There is clear progression from initial ideas to the final outcome, and the candidate has demonstrated an ability to realise their intentions along their **creative journey**.
- The candidate's **intentions** are clear throughout the response, even though ideas and aims change direction. For example, they have explored breaking objects and painting from these to explore ideas, as well as using mixed media to create 3D forms.

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**Mark awarded = 86 out of 100**

- Understanding of **visual language** is effective throughout the work and is enhanced by skilful rendering of media. This is demonstrated in the pen and ink, pencil, pastel and paint studies of the building, the boy and 3D objects throughout the portfolio and in the final outcome, which demonstrate understanding of colour, tone, form, composition and perspective.
- The response clearly and thoughtfully **communicates** the candidate's ability to **analyse, reflect, and evaluate ideas** and make relevant critical decisions.
