



### Lesson 23: Research methods 7.7 Ethical guidelines

<b>Learning objective</b>	To gain knowledge and understanding of ethical guidelines
<b>Lesson objectives</b>	By the end of the lesson, learners will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identify ethical issues</li> <li>• Apply ethical guidelines to novel scenarios</li> </ul>

<b>Beginning (5 mins)</b>	Learners complete the starter activity recalling as many of the guidelines as they can in one minute. They can share with a partner to include any guidelines they missed in their list. <b>Middle (50 mins)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ask learners to select 5-6 scenarios from the ethics presentation. For each scenario, ask them to identify any ethical issues and explain why that guidelines was broken or followed.</li> <li>• In small groups, ask learners to rank order the scenarios in terms of most to least ethical. Learners can feedback their results to the group, with a justification of the rank order they chose.</li> <li>• As a whole class, discuss the ethical guidelines broken in each case. Use question and answer to explore why psychologists sometimes find it difficult to follow ethical guidelines.</li> </ul>	
<b>End (5 mins)</b>	Learners can identify one ethical issue in the scenario and explain how it could be improved, then peer-mark using the success criteria.
