

Examiner comments and final marks (Video 1)

Part 1 Interview

Grammar: The candidate uses some range of structures, but these are not always accurate.

Vocabulary: The candidate uses some range of vocabulary to discuss mostly simple content.

Development: Responses are relevant and there is an attempt at development.

Pronunciation: The pronunciation is mostly clear with communication partly impeded. Intonation is rarely used to convey meaning.

Part 2 Short talk

Grammar: The candidate uses a range of simple structures and attempts complex structures. Errors generally don't impede communication.

Vocabulary: The candidate just uses a sufficient range of vocabulary appropriately to discuss ideas, though there is some repetition.

Development: The candidate responds relevantly. She attempts to develop some comparisons, justifying her preference. Her response to the disadvantages, even after prompting, lacks reasonable development.

Pronunciation: The pronunciation is mostly clear with communication partly impeded by fillers and repeated words. Although intonation is sometimes used to convey meaning, it is not with great effect.

Part 3 Discussion

Grammar: The candidate uses a sufficient range of simple structures with some accuracy. Some complex structures are used but with limited accuracy. Errors can impede communication.

Vocabulary: The candidate uses some range of vocabulary appropriately, discussing some ideas which are beyond simple.

Development: Responses are relevant with some development. Support isn't given, but communication is maintained.

Pronunciation: The pronunciation is mostly clear with communication partly impeded by fillers and repeated words. Although intonation is sometimes used to convey meaning, overall, it is not effective.

The final marks awarded are:

Mark awarded for Grammar = 6 out of 10

Mark awarded for Vocabulary = 7 out of 10

Mark awarded for Development = 6 out of 10

Mark awarded for Pronunciation = 6 out of 10
