| Beginning (5 mins) | Learners complete the starter activity to get them thinking about practical applications of different theories of motivation. | |
| Middle (50 mins) | As a class discuss the outcomes of the think, pair, share starter activity. Explain the task to learners – they are to imagine they are psychologists hired to solve real-world problems using motivation theories. Allocate learners to small groups and assign them one case study brief. The groups design either a leaflet for the client (e.g., the teacher, coach, or parent) based on the theory with advice, or a short action plan with recommended steps, written in accessible language. As groups work, circulate and ask questions, e.g. 'How would this actually work in practice?' 'What if the strategy doesn't work?' | |
