Learners should make notes and ask questions.• Ask learners to create a diagram (or add to their diagrams of the MSM) to show where and how the three types of forgetting occur in the multistore model of memory.• In pairs, learners can work together to read and respond to the novel scenarios on forgetting.	
End (5 mins)	Learners check their understanding by creating their own novel scenario to illustrate forgetting through decay
