Beginning (5 mins)	Learners to generate ideas individually about how they learn and revise best.	n/a
Middle (50 mins)	Think, pair, share on learning and revision strategies. Discuss in pairs which strategy works best and why.	
	 Organise learners' ideas on whiteboard, categorise ideas into the levels of processing. 	
	 Define levels of processing and explain that storage is a by-product of processing. 	
	 Give learners the novel scenario to work on in a small group, ask them to design a strategy for each level of processing. 	
	 Lead a class discussion on the effectiveness of each strategy. 	
End (5 mins)	Learners check understanding through the quiz and self-assess against the answers.
